Sermon Series: "First Peter: Stand Firm"

Scripture: 1 Peter 1:22-25

- 1. Liking other believers (V. 22a)
 - o Life lesson: Build church family relationships, because **you were made for this**.

1 Peter 1:22 (ESV) — **22** Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart,

2. Loving other believers (V. 22b-25)

1 Peter 1:22–25 (ESV) — 22 Having purified your souls by your obedience to the truth for a sincere brotherly love, love one another earnestly from a pure heart, 23 since you have been born again, not of perishable seed but of imperishable, through the living and abiding word of God; 24 for "All flesh is like grass and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass withers, and the flower falls, 25 but the word of the Lord remains forever." And this word is the good news that was preached to you.

o Life lesson: Commit to your church family as if you will spend eternity with them (because you will).

COMMITMENTS IN THE CHURCH FAMILY I will make the church gathering my weekly priority, not weekly option. I will look for ways to encourage at least one person at church. I will reach out to at least one person I've never met at church before. I will pray and care for church family members in need. I will look to build church family relationships during the week. I will serve the church family at least once a week. I will invite at least one person to join our church family each month.

- ➤ Have someone read Sunday's passage: 1 Peter 1:22-25
 - o What truths stand out to you?
 - 1. What are some of the challenges in liking other believers?
 - o What are some ways that you have learned to like other believers in the church family more?
 - o How would you encourage someone who told you they left their church because they didn't like several people in the church family?
 - 2. What does a deepening commitment to love other believers in the church family look like?
 - o Can someone love their church family and yet not serve in the church? Why or why not?
 - o What can serving our church family teach us about our walk with Christ?
 - 3. What are three or four key factors in relating to other believers?
 - o How important is it to commit to a life time with your church family since we will spend eternity together?
 - o Are there any relationships in your church family that need to be reconciled?
 - Spend time in prayer as a group seeking God's wisdom in how to reconcile any broken or strained relationships.
