Scripture: I Peter 2:9-10

1 Peter 2:9–10 (ESV) — **9** But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. **10** Once you were not a people, but now you are God's people; once you had not received mercy, but now you have received mercy.

1. A holy nation

- Life lessons:
 - Realize that **you are a saint**.
 - Be loyal to **your people**.

HOW BE LOYAL TO THE CHURCH FAMILY

1. Ask God to help you love the church **as Christ did.**
2. Make a **lifelong commitment** to your church family.
3. Be a giver, not a taker.
4. Watch over others.
5. Guard the **good name of the church.**
6. Learn to mourn with those who mourn.

- o Life lesson: Quit **your life!**
