Sermon Series: "On Mission Together"

What we do: Glorify God. Love people. Make disciples How we do it: "In God's strength we equip believers with biblical teaching to become more like Jesus and reach the lost."

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 5:17-21

2 Corinthians 5:17–21 (ESV) — 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 18 All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation. 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

1. Our calling to the lost (V. 17-18)

2 Corinthians 5:17–18 (ESV) — 17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. 18 All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation;

- Life lesson: We're on mission together to respond to two callings:
 - 1. Personal reconciliation to God
 - 2. The ministry of reconciliation
- 2. Our communication to the lost (V. 19)
- 2 Corinthians 5:19 (ESV) 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation
 - Life lesson: We're on mission together to verbally share the aospel.
 - 3. Our representation to the lost (V. 20-21)
- 2 Corinthians 5:20–21 (ESV) 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. 21 For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.
 - Life lesson: We're on mission together to represent a countercultural message.

- Have someone read Sunday's passage: 2 Corinthians 5:17-20
 What truths stand out to you?
 - 1. What does it mean to be reconciled to God?
 - o What is the ministry of reconciliation?
 - How do we live out our calling to the lost in this ministry of reconciliation?
 - What does it look like at work?
 - What does it look like in our families?
 - What does it look like in our neighborhood?
 - 2. What are the dangers of "living the gospel" and not verbally sharing the message?
 - o What keeps you from sharing the gospel more often?
 - How can you overcome your reservations in sharing the gospel?
 - 3. List several countercultural messages of Christianity.
 - What makes Christianity so unpopular to many people?
 - How can anyone believe in the countercultural message of the cross?
 - Hint: The sovereignty of God
 - As a group, pray for people you know who need salvation in Christ.
