### Scripture: Acts 3

#### 1. The unpopular message of human guilt (Vs. 12-15a)

- **Life lesson:** We must continue to defend the unpopular truth that without Christ, we're in a state of guilt.

#### 2. The unpopular message of the cross (Vs. 15b-18)

- **Life lesson:** We must continue to defend the cross as the central element of God's eternal design.

#### 3. The unpopular message of repentance (V. 19)

- **Life lesson:** We must continue to defend repentance as inseparably linked to true faith.

- Have someone read Sunday's passage: Acts 3:12-19
  - What truths stand out to you?
- 1. Why is it so difficult to accept our guilt before God?
  - Why is it so important to communicate the truth that humans are guilty before God?
  - What is the hope for our guilt before God?
- 2. What are the results of a belief that the cross was not ordained by God?
  - What are the results of a belief that the cross was ordained by God?
  - Why is the resurrection after the cross such an important part of God's plan?
- 3. How would you respond to someone who said, "I don't need to repent of my sin in trusting Christ because that would be a good work. I believe in God's grace alone."?
  - Is repentance a required work, a result of salvation or a simultaneous work with salvation?
  - Why is it so important to understand the role and timing of repentance?
