### The four summits of the believer’s afterlife:

1. The intermediate separation
2. The completion of the body
3. The intermediate kingdom
4. The completion of the kingdom

#### 1. Relationships with believers (V. 23)

- o **Life lesson:** We can look forward to restored and trusted relationships.

## 2. Relationships with non-believers (V. 24-31)

- **Life lesson:** Since there is no second chance after death, now is the time to share the Gospel.

  - What truths stand out to you?
- 1. Other than Jesus, who would you like to have a new friendship with in eternity?
  - Since it's the eternal will of God that all relationships are healed, is there anyone that you need to reconcile with?
  - What are some steps that could be taken toward reconciliation?
- 2. Why are many "Christians" starting to believe that there is no hell in the afterlife?
  - What does this false teaching reveal about people's view of God's love and justice?
  - How would you respond to someone who said that a loving God would never send anyone to hell?
  - Why are Christians often tempted to judge nonbelievers?
  - What are some good ways to communicate the love and forgiveness found in Christ?
