Scripture: Luke 16

The four summits of the believer's afterlife:

- 1. The intermediate separation
- 2. The completion of the body
- 3. The intermediate kingdom
- 4. The completion of the kingdom
- 1. Relationships with believers (V. 23)
 - o **Life lesson:** We can look forward to restored and trusted relationships.

- 2. Relationships with non-believers (V. 24-31)
 - Life lesson: Since there is no second chance after death, now is the time to share the Gospel.

 - 2. Why are many "Christians" starting to believe that there is no hell in the afterlife?
 - What does this false teaching reveal about people's view of God's love and iustice?
 - How would you respond to someone who said that a loving God would never send anyone to help?
 - o Why are Christians often tempted to judge nonbelievers?
 - What are some good ways to communicate the love and forgiveness found in Christ?
