FALSE VIEW	STATEMENT OF VIEW	RESPONSE
1. Universal skepticism	“No truth is knowable”	The statement, “No truth is knowable” is a statement of “truth”.
2. Universal subjectivism	“Everyone’s opinions are true.”	Opposing opinions cannot both be true.
3. Religious skepticism	“We can know truth, except beliefs about God.”	The statement, “We can know truth, except truth about God” is a belief about God (that He is unknowable).
4. Religious subjectivism	“Everyone’s truth about God is valid.”	Opposing opinions cannot both be true.
